

Speaker 1: After someone is injured on a construction site, it's extremely important to move quickly to get to a scene, to take photographs, to interview witnesses because those types of cases are notorious for information changing, evidence disappearing. So we look to, as fast as possible, conduct a full, thorough investigation, not just of what happened, what was going on at the scene at the time, but who was involved. Because oftentimes in an active construction site, there's a general contractor and there are multiple subcontractors and there are lots of workers involved doing different things at a construction site, and you need to know who was there, who worked for whom, and what role each one of them played. So you can figure out how an incident occurred, why it occurred, and who may be responsible.
