

Stephen W.: I think it's worth noting that the insurance companies are big, and their MO is to defend these cases regardless of the underlying merit of the claim, regardless of what the evidence may show. They have investigators. They have large resources and money that they will spend to defend these cases. They hire teams of lawyers to defend these cases. Lawyers who do these cases almost exclusively and have tremendous experience.

So, if you're going to go up against one of these insurance companies and you expect to win, to achieve a good result, you 100% need a lawyer who does this kind of work all the time, has been doing it a long time, and has substantial experience standing up for injured folks, fighting insurance companies and winning. A lawyer who has a long proven track record of taking these cases to court and winning these cases and beating back the insurance companies' arguments in front of judges and to jurors.
