We have circumstances where people are injured on public roadways and walkways, in buildings or other premises that the city either owns or manages or maintains.

We have employees or agents of the City of New York acting improperly or not doing what they're supposed to be doing to keep premises, to keep situations safe so that people don't get hurt. When things go wrong in any number of those scenarios or contexts, we hold the city accountable.
